## Hospice Grief Camp dates set!

Mount Airy, NC - On July 21 and 22, Mountain Valley Hospice & Palliative Care is holding its annual grief camp for youth, ages 5-18, who have experienced a significant loss in their life.

The camp is an extension of Mountain Valley Hospice's Kids Path program and has been offered by Mountain Valley for the past XX years.

The two-day camp uses a variety of games and activities to teach young people ways to cope with grief and build confidence. "Grief camp is important," said Katie Moser, Kids Path Counselor, "because it provides a relaxed, fun-filled environment where a child can express their sorrow while making connections with other children who have experienced similar loss." Kids Path Grief Camp will be held at Dobson First Baptist Church, 204 South Crutchfield Street in Dobson, North Carolina on Thursday and Friday, July 21 and 22, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. On the final day of camp, parents and families are invited to a special memorial service after camp. This program is free to all families with children and teens who have or are experiencing grief.



Safety of our campers, families, volunteers and staff is top priority. Camp leaders and participants will follow state and local COVID-19 guidelines that are in place at the time of camp.
