Hospice Grief Camp dates set!

Mount Airy, NC - On June 8 and 9, Mountain Valley is holding an annual grief camp for children and teens who have experienced a significant loss in their life. The camp is an extension of Mountain Valley's Kids Path program. The two-day event is offered to children and teens, ages 5-18.

"Camp uses a variety of games and activities to teach kids ways to cope with grief and build confidence. Grief Camp is important," said Katie Moser, Kids Path Counselor, "because it provides a relaxed, fun-filled environment where a child can express their sorrow while making connections with other children who have experienced similar loss."

This summer camp will be located at Wilkes Family YMCA in Wilkesboro, North Carolina on June 8 and 9, between 8am and 5pm. The YMCA is located at 1801 YMCA Boulevard.

On the final day of camp, parents and families are invited to a special evening memorial after camp.
