Hospice Grief Camp Dates Set

Mount Airy, NC - On July 27-28, Mountain Valley is holding an annual grief camp for children who have experienced a significant loss in their life. The camp is an extension of Mountain Valley's Kids Path program. The two-day event is offered to children and teens, ages 5-18.

"We use a variety of games and activities to teach kids ways to cope with grief and build confidence. Grief Camp is important," said Katie Moser, Kids Path Counselor, "because it provides a relaxed, fun-filled environment where a child can express their sorrow while making connections with other children who have experienced similar loss."

This summer camp will be held at Mount Airy Wesleyan Church on July 27-28, between 8am and 5pm. Mount Airy Wesleyan Church is located at 2063 South Main Street in Mount Airy.

On the final day of camp, parents and families are invited to a special evening memorial after camp. This program is free to all families with children and teens who have/are experiencing grief.
