Hospice care levels

All Medicare-certified hospices are required to offer four levels of hospice care depending on patient and caregiver needs.



Routine home care

This is the most common level of care in hospice. Patients are generally stable and their symptoms, like pain, nausea and vomiting, are adequately controlled. This is usually provided in the home.

General inpatient care

Crisis-like level of care for short-term management of out of control patient pain and/or symptoms. This is usually provided outside the home in an inpatient setting at a medical facility like a hospital or skilled nursing facility.

Continuous home care

Crisis-like level of care for short-term management of out of control patient pain and/or symptoms. This is usually provided in the home.

Respite care

A level of temporary care provided in a nursing home, hospice inpatient facility, or hospital so that a family member or friend who's the patient's caregiver can take some time off. This level of care is tied to caregiver needs, not patient symptoms.

SPINACH AND ARTICHOKE DIP Kathy Sprinkle

Ingredients

10 oz frozen chopped spinach (thawed)

1 lg garlic clove finely chopped 2 (14 oz) cans artichoke hearts, drained and chopped ³/₄ cup mayonnaise 8 oz cream cheese 1 Tbsp hot sauce

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees

1½ cup shredded Parmesan cheese

- 2. Drain water from spinach
- 3. Mix all ingredients
- 4. Bake in casserole dish for 30 minutes
- 5. Remove from oven and sprinkle remaining Parmesan cheese on top
- 6. Place back in oven until cheese is melted and light brown
