Comfort-focused car

Mountain Valley provides specialized medical support for people with a seriou advanced illness. Our goal is to improve quality of life for the patient and family. Services of this nature are sometimes referred to as palliative or comfort-focused care.

Team approac

Our palliative care team works with the patient's current specialists and primary care providers for consult services and as an added layer of support for patients and families. We help manage distressing symptoms and provide valuable expertise during complex decision making and goals of care discussions. Patients may continue with aggressive medical care, in-home care skilled nursing, physical therapy, and other specialized care, with no interruption to those services. We accept Original Medicar Part B. Medicaid, or private insurance (co-pays may apply).

Our care centers offer a warm and secure homelike setting. A transition to one of our care centers is beneficial when there's a need for symptom when caregivers need a period of rest.




